Examples of relevant projects within the framework of NSDI

The most important activites related to the development of a NSDI in the Czech Republic include:

- The development of spatial reference databases with increased compatibility via a core register of spatial identifiers
- The development of key national datasets accessible via the Internet such as the Cadastral Information System (ISKN) and ZABAGED,
- A series of very important awareness and educational activities in the public
 administration to support administrative reform (led by CAGI and Ministry
 of Interior), and in primary and secondary schools participating in the
 international GLOBE project. This initiative involved over 100 schools to
 teach pupils about spatial data, and was promoted by TEREZA, the
 association for ecological education, in partnership with CAGI.
- Promotion and scientific activities including regular GI conferences across the country, and the creation of a GEO-application award focused on the use of geoinformation and Inter/Intranets to increase the performance of public administration and improve public information services. This event was organised in 1999/2000 by CAGI together with Czech Ministry of Interior, section for public administration reform, Union of Towns and Municipalities and the Office for Public Information Systems. Given the success of this event and the high interest it created, it is envisaged that it will be repeated in following years
- Participation in several international and EU funded projects such as PANEL-GI.
- Participation in the development and promotion of a series of national standards related to the structure and transfer format for large-scale maps (including the Digital Technical Maps for Urban areas and Urban Plans), and



Spatial Data Interest Community (SDIC)

Spatial Data Interest Communities (SDICs) bundle the human expertise of users, producers and transformers of spatial information, technical competence, financial resources and policies, with an interest to better use these resources for spatial data management and the development and operation of spatial information services. Through their activities they drive the demand for spatial data and spatial information services. Environmental monitoring, reporting and development of applications and services for environmental management are among the main driving forces behind the natural formation of SDICs. SDICs are best placed to know what spatial data is required in implementing different environmental tasks, ranging from local, regional, and national to Pan-European applications.

Role: The involvement of stakeholders can be one or more of the following: keep informed, review INSPIRE deliverables, propose experts, submit reference material, and/or test draft specifications. Registration is continuously open.

EUROGI/eSDI-Net: At a glance

The EUROGI/eSDI-Net initiative is a Thematic Network formerly co-founded by the EC and now advanced by EUROGI from its own resources. The initiative aims to foster the dialogue between European sub-national SDI stakeholders by providing a platform so that knowledge and Best Practises' experiences are being shared.

In 2010, EUROGI took over the legacy of the eSDINet plus project, a thematic Network confounded by the eContent plus programme.

EUROGI supports the sustainability of this Thematic network and ensures the continuation of the initiative and efforts of the project:

- The SDI best practices database (2009 2011)
- The <u>SDI self-assessment framework (SDI-SAF)</u>. The main objective is to help SDIs to characterize and describe themselves. A clear understanding of its own strengths and weaknesses is needed to identify and follow a successfully implementation path. Comparisons with other SDIs is a useful exercise: SDI-SAF is intended for this. It provides a checklist useful to better focus on key issues in developing an SDI.

The main public activity of the eSDI-Netplus Project was the international Conference <u>"European SDI Best Practice"</u> Awards 2009. Learning from Best Practices" in Turin, Italy, November 2009, where twelve outstanding SDIs were awarded. The Conference was the provisional conclusion of a process that started in 2008 with the identification of promising SDIs in more than 20 European countries and the definition of a methodology to analyse SDIs: more than 200 sub-national or thematic SDIs were evaluated.

CONFERENCE FOCUS

The main aim of the conference is to identify opportunities arising from the application of both existing and emerging geospatial data, services and technologies. Promoting job creation, achieving more efficient and effective public sector policy making and services' delivery, and the creation of a more informed public are all areas of focus.

The conference will adopt a mainly non-technical approach to the issues. Each of the two days will end with sessions focussing on 'who needs to do what, when' to realise the opportunities identified during the earlier sessions.

IRISH PRESIDENCY ASSOCIATED EVENT

The EUROGI ima conference is one of three linked conferences taking place at the Convention Centre in the same week, all of which have jointly received the Irish Presidency Associated Event designation. The European Environment Agency's Eye on Earth User conference will take place on 4, 5 and 6 March while the European Commission's Directorate General Joint Research Centre's Envirofi conference will take place on 6 March. A key overall theme across all the conferences is Geographic Information (GI).
